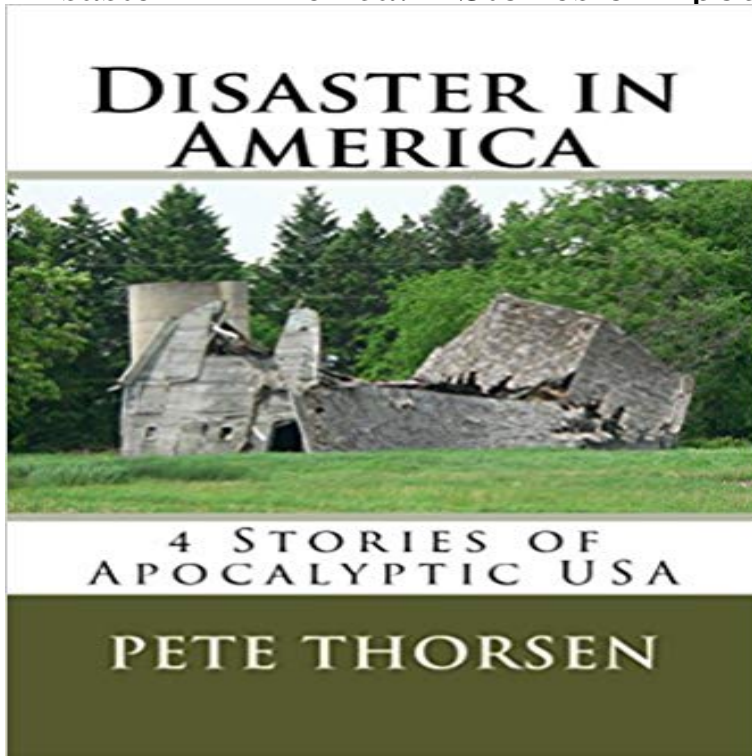


Disaster in America: 4 Stories of Apocalyptic USA
