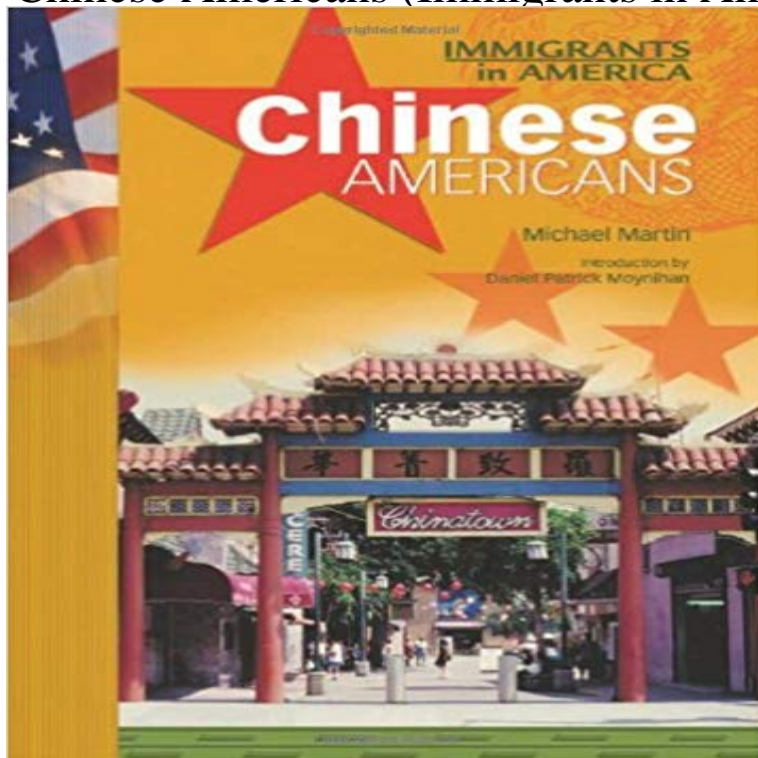


## Chinese Americans (Immigrants in America)
