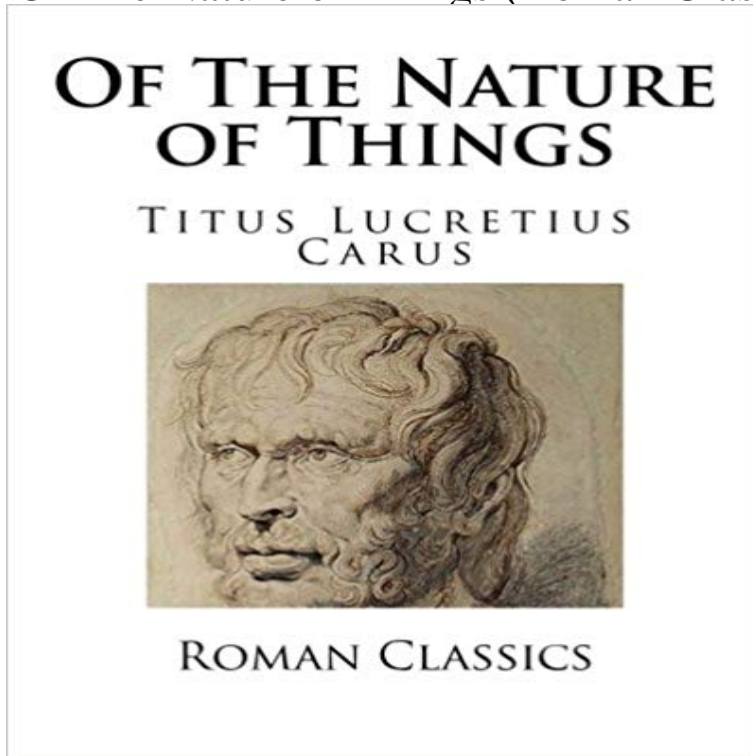

Of The Nature of Things By Titus Lucretius Carus Roman Classics Translation By William Ellery Leonard Titus Lucretius Carus (c. 99 BC c. 55 BC) was a Roman poet and philosopher. His only known work is the epic philosophical poem *De rerum natura* about the beliefs of Epicureanism, and which is translated into English as *On the Nature of Things* or *On the Nature of the Universe*. Virtually nothing is known about the life of Lucretius. Jerome tells how he was driven mad by a love potion and wrote his poetry between fits of insanity, eventually committing suicide in middle age; but modern scholarship suggests this account was probably an invention. The *De rerum natura* was a considerable influence on the Augustan poets, particularly Virgil (in his *Aeneid* and *Georgics*, and to a lesser extent in his *Eclogues*) and Horace. It virtually disappeared during the Middle Ages, but was rediscovered in a monastery in Germany in 1417, by Poggio Bracciolini, and played an important role both in the development of atomism (Lucretius was an important influence on Pierre Gassendi) and the efforts of various figures of the Enlightenment era to construct a new Christian humanism.
